#### **Music Scholarships**

It is intended that the scholarship will continue for the period of <name>'s schooling at St Patrick's College; however, its continuation is subject to the following conditions:

- the scholarship holder continuing to study Music as a classroom subject up to VCE Unit 3/4 Music, inclusive
- the scholarship holder participates in the full Music program offered at St Patrick's College, performing in concerts regularly, both as a soloist and ensemble member, both in and out of school hours
- the scholarship holder participating in two or more ensembles across Years 7-10, and/or participating in at least one an ensemble whilst undertaking VCE Music studies; and committing to all required performances for these ensembles throughout the year.
- the scholarship holder maintaining a minimum 80% attendance in all ensembles the student is a member of
- the scholarship holder's level of performance in the Performing Arts continuing at a high standard, throughout the duration of the scholarship;
- the scholarship holder continuing to undertake instrumental lessons on their chosen instrument/s
- the scholarship holder continuing to be an example to other students in terms of work ethic, application and continuing to act as a role mode to other students

#### Speech and Drama Scholarships

It is intended that the scholarship will continue for the period of <name>'s schooling at St Patrick's College; however, its continuation is subject to the following conditions:

- the scholarship holder continuing to study Theatre Studies as a classroom subject up to VCE Unit 3/4 Theatre Studies, inclusive
- the scholarship holder participates in the full Speech and Drama program offered at St Patrick's College, including the College Musical and Purton Oratory Competition
- the scholarship holder participates regularly in public speaking events, both in and out of school hours
- the scholarship holder's level of performance in Speech and Drama continuing at a high standard, throughout the duration of the scholarship;
- the scholarship holder continuing to be an example to other students in terms of work ethic, application and continuing to act as a role mode to other students.
