2022 VCE Results

Today we celebrate the release of our 2022 VCE results, which reflect the dedication and hard work of all our staff and students.

I would like to offer my sincere thanks and congratulations to all students, as well as our teaching and support staff, for what was, in many ways, a challenging year for our community. Our students, in particular, showed incredible resilience, perseverance and determination and we are incredibly proud of their achievements.

The purpose of this communication is to provide our community with a snapshot of our key VCE achievements for 2022.

Summary of Outcomes:

- The 2022 College Dux, with an incredible ATAR of 99.25, is Toby Clack
- 174 students completed VCE Year 12 studies at St Patrick's College in 2022; 142 of these students gained an ATAR, whilst 32 of these students completed a non-ATAR VCE pathway
- There were 276 Senior School students enrolled in at least one VCE Unit 3/4 subject in 2022
- 14 students gained an ATAR of above 90 (10% of students), which is an increase from 11 students in 2021
- 36 students (overall) gained an ATAR of above 80 (over 25% of students), which is an increase from 29 students (overall) in 2021
- Our median ATAR in 2022 is 70.52, which is an increase from 62.45 in 2021
- The median study score for all VCE and VET studies was 29, which is up from a Median Study Score of 28 in 2021 and 2020
- In terms of study scores, 49.2% were at 30 or above (at or above the state average). For comparison, in 2021, 39.9% were 30 or above, so we have many more students scoring above the state average
- 27 students achieved study scores above 40, placing them in the top 9% of the state for that study; 6 of those scored above 45, placing them in the top 2% of the state for that study
- 125 of our senior students enrolled and satisfactorily passed VET units across 24 VET studies (87% of enrolments)
- 122 students applied for a tertiary place in 2022 (70% of all 2022 Year 12 students)

Traditionally, an **ATAR of 90** or above has been used as a measure of academic excellence. In 2022, the following students attained this outstanding result:
