

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS OF VET CLUSTER STUDENTS



FOLLOW YOUR HOME SCHOOL PROCEDURES

Students are required to follow the procedures of their home school when leaving to attend their VET Program. This includes signing out if applicable.



TRAVEL DIRECTLY FROM YOUR HOME SCHOOL TO THE VET PROGRAM VENUE

Students are required to travel directly from their home school to the VETDSS venue and not stop off along the way. Parents are responsible for travel arrangements for their child to and from the VET venue.



BE ON TIME FOR CLASS

Students are required to be in class by the class start time, usually 1.45 pm until 5 pm. If you arrive late, you will be marked as a partial absence and your parents and home school are notified via email.



RUNNING LATE? NOTIFY YOUR SCHOOL AND PROGRAM TEACHER

If you are running late please notify your home school VET Coordinator and the Program Teacher.



NEED TO LEAVE EARLY? YOUR PARENTS NEED TO NOTIFY YOUR SCHOOL

If you are required to leave class early, you must provide a note from your parent/carer to your home school VET Coordinator.



STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO STAY AT THE VET VENUE DURING BREAK

Students are under the care of their home school while at their VET Program, therefore they must stay at the venue at all times, including during breaks. Your school will be notified if you leave without a note from your parent



EXPLORE, DISCOVER, LEARN

VET is applied learning, students put into practice, skills learned in the classroom in a real world setting. VET is adult learning that requires you to be organised and self-motivated. It can lead to an apprenticeship, further study or employment.

I follow OH&S procedures and use PPE where required.

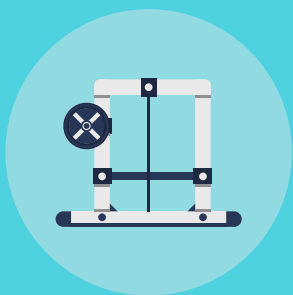


I'm organised
