The SPC 1st XI team travelled to Brisbane’s Nudge College for the 40th Christian Brothers Cricket Week.

Monday 6th January - Round 1 against Nudgee College 2

James Doherty won the toss and elected to bat first. After some early morning rain there was plenty of humidity to go with the 30 degree forecast.

James Doherty and Ryan Aikman opened the batting and were looking very comfortable before James was caught behind for 11. With the score at 1/21 Daniel Lalor was the new batsman and we had high expectations, but he didn’t last long and was out for 3. Ryan Aikman then fell shortly after for 6 leaving us in a bit of trouble at 3/27 after 8 overs. Lachlan Constable and Kyle Smith then steadied the innings putting on a 37 run partnership before Kyle fell for 16. Noah Steenhuis and Lachlan then put on a 49 run partnership with Noah only making 6 before he was out with the score at 5 for 112. Lachlan then brought up his 50, but then tried his luck once too often and was out for 52. At 6/124 we were in need of some lower order runs. The Marsh boys Spence Jenks and Hamish Garner then formed our best partnership of the day with 68, before Spence was out for 22. Hamish then brought up his 50, but was dismissed the next ball. Harry Venner then put on 13 runs with Ryan Densley. Harry was dismissed for 7 and then Regan King was bowled first ball. Ryan finished 6 not out, as we were all out with 2 overs left for 212.

Tuesday 7th January- Round 2 against St Edmunds

James Doherty lost the toss and was sent in to bat on a small but picturesque Wilkes Oval. Hamish Garner was promoted to the top of the order after an impressive innings yesterday to partner Ryan Aikman. After a shaky start with a dropped chance and a few near misses the boys managed to keep their wickets and were 0/22 after 10. Seeing off the new ball they increased their scoring and started to find the boundaries. After putting on an opening stand of 119, Hamish was the first to go, after compiling a great 58 from 84 balls including 2 sixes and 8 fours. James Doherty then joined Ryan who was on 43, and changed the game with only 20 overs to go. In the 49th over we had Ryan and James both on 99, and with consecutive deliveries both brought up their centuries. James finished on 100 not out off 63 balls including 12 fours and 4 sixes, whilst Ryan was bowled on the second last ball for 100 off 154 including 12 fours and 1 six. Together they had a 176 run partnership off only 122 balls. This saw us finish with a very impressive 295 from the 50 overs.

St Edmunds started their innings slowly trying to copy our approach, but that didn't last as the first wicket came in the 5th over when Alex Kerr was too quick in the field and his throw to Ryan Aikman saw their opener run out with their score on 15. Regan King then picked up the next wicket when he hit the top of off stump. 2/33 quickly became 3/33 when James Martindale picked up his first the next over. When Daniel Lalor picked up his first they were 4/53 after 19 overs and starting to get well behind the required rate. Leo Turnbull-Gent then came into the attack and picked up 3 wickets in his spell to finish with 3/33 from his 6 overs. At 8/127 this looked like it would finish quickly, but a bit of lower order hitting saw them push through to 182. A very impressive 113 run victory.

Round 3 against Gregory Terrace

Today we travelled down to Gregory Terrace in Tennyson to play the only other undefeated team in a T20 match.

Again we lost the toss and again they sent us in to bat. Today we went back to the traditional T20 pairing of Ryan Aikman and James Doherty both fresh of centuries. Ryan was the first to be dismissed for 2, with Daniel Lalor also falling cheaply for only 12. At 2/47 Lachie Constable and James steading the innings and put on 79 runs before James was dismissed for 60. Lachie was dismissed shortly after for 42 with Hamish

Garner 14 NO and Kyle Smith 3 NO, a total of 150 looked to be a good score in the conditions.

A 48 run final wicket partnership delayed the result before the final wicket fell at 156 for a 64 run victory and our first ever victory in the CBCW Cup competition.
