Cricket

1st XI Match against Geelong Grammar

On Sunday October 20 our 1st XI team travelled down to Geelong College to play our annual match. With a number of players unavailable, there was an opportunity for a few new faces to impress ahead of the BAS season. Lachie Constable was the acting skipper and after winning the toss decided to bat first. Bailey Hosemans and Hamish Garner opened the batting and were able to see out the first 6 overs. The 7th over was a big over for Geelong College, with Hamish getting an inside edge and being bowled off the first ball without scoring. Lachie Constable then came in and was out first ball, bowled by a big inswinger. This put Spence Jenks under the pressure of having to face a hattrick ball, and unfortunately he received another great delivery and was bowled first ball. At this point we were in big trouble at 3/8 after 7 overs. Bailey Hosemans and Kyle Smith then battled through and formed a great partnership. Bailey was eventually dismissed for 44, after a 51 run partnership that stabilised our innings. Following his dismissal Alonzo Solomon didn't last long and was caught for 1 and then Ari Davis followed shortly afterwards without scoring. These 3 quick wickets saw us in trouble at 6/62 after 28 overs. But the arrival of Bailey Ryan signalled the start of a big recovery. Together Kyle and Bailey added 92 runs to lead us to a respectable total. Kyle eventually fell in the last over after scoring 60 off 111 balls, whilst Bailey finished on 45 not out. 6 for 157 was a respectable score given the loss of early wickets. Regan King took the new ball along with Youhana Mani, and the bowling and fielding was excellent for the first 7 overs with Geelong College only scoring 9 runs. But as they looked to increase their scoring the boundaries started to come. 9 fours in the next 6 overs boosted their run rate as Alonzo Solomon and Alex Kerr came into the attack. A number of dropped chances and edges through the slips didn't help our cause. Alonzo Solomon picked up the first wicket in the 14th over to have them 1/50. The introduction of Ari Davis and Bailey Ryan into the attack had immediate effect with Ari picking up a wicket in his first over and then Bailey had 2 in the next. At 4/79 the game was in the balance, but a 74 run partnership had them very close to victory when Bailey Ryan claimed his third wicket to have the scores tied at 5/157 after 34 overs. Geelong secured victory and continued to bat out their 50 overs, finishing at 10 for 241, late wickets to Hamish Garner, Noah Maggi, Josh McGrath and Bailey Hoseman. Bailey Ryan was the best of the bowlers with 4 for 42 from his 10 overs.
