### 1<sup>st</sup> XI

#### **Round 2 1<sup>st</sup> XI BAS T20 against Ballarat Grammar**

Round 2 of the T20 comp was a replay of last year's grand final at Ballarat Grammar. James Doherty won the toss and decided to bat on a pitch that was sure to offer the bowlers plenty of assistance due to the recent wet weather. James and Ryan Aikman opened the batting and put on 15 before Ryan was dismissed for 3. James was dismissed shortly after for 9. Daniel Lalor and Lachie Constable consolidated the innings with some good running between the wickets, before Daniel was dismissed for 7, with the score at 3 for 33. Bailey Hosemans then joined Lachie and took the score to 45 before Lachie was dismissed for 17. Jack Jeffrey came to the crease and looked to be hitting the ball well before he was out for 8. Kyle Smith came in and worked the ball for 4 before he was out stumped. At 6 for 70 we needed the tailenders to stick around for the final 4 overs. But unfortunately, Noah Steenhuis, Kento Dobell, Regan King and James Martindale only managed 1 run between them. This left Bailey Hosemans still there at the end unbeaten on 18 with still 13 balls remaining. A final score of 76 was below expectations, but with a pitch providing plenty for the bowlers there was confidence amongst the group.

Regan King came back into the attack and picked up the 8<sup>th</sup> wicket to have Grammar 8/51. A run out from Ryan Aikman throwing to Regan and then the final wicket to Regan in the 19<sup>th</sup> over saw Ballarat Grammar dismissed for 62. A 14 run victory thanks to a great performance with the ball.

The boys made a 50 run opening partnership before Ryan was out for 14 off 20 balls in the 7<sup>th</sup> over. Daniel Lalor joined James and were scoring freely, putting on 78 runs from only 51 balls, before Daniel was out for 48 off 27 balls. Lachie Constable joined James who was now on 60. Lachie looked to score quickly and with only a few overs to go, but was dismissed for 8. Bailey Hosemans came and went quickly thanks to some good fielding to run him out. Jack Jeffrey joined James for the final 13 balls. James had now made his way to 75 but would need a lot of luck to get to a hundred. With the final over to be bowled James was on 79, with only 6 balls to bring up his hundred and Jack Jeffrey on strike. The first game was against Damascus College. Despite every endeavour SPC was dominant in all aspects of the game. Superb performances saw Bailey Hosemans make 67 retired not out. His score included eleven 4's. Also, in great form was Hamish Garner, Riley Fisher and Harry Venner who made quick runs and hit some well executed 4's and 6's. At the end of the innings SPC made 2/246. In reply Damascus were bowled out for 46. Strong bowling performances included Harry Carlyon 3/5 and Tom Gorman 3/9.

In the second game, SPC played Ballarat College. Once again, the SPC boys dominated the game. Ballarat College batted first and were dismissed, all out, for 80 runs. The SPC bowlers were effective with wickets shared between Ari Davis, Spence Jenks, Hamish Garner and Joshua McGrath. There were also some excellent fielding performances which included three run outs. Of note were the quick hands of Noah Ryan. The SPC batsmen continued to play with great skill and intent with Riley Fisher making 50 and Hamish Garner 38. In total SPC won surpassing the College score in the 15th over.

The third game was washed out due to inclement weather but game four saw SPC play Ballarat Grammar on turf at Grammar. SPC batted first and were tested initially by a tight bowling attack from Ballarat Grammar. Alex Byham opened the batting and made a solid 14 which set up a successful innings for SPC. Our batsmen then dominated play with Riley Fisher making 41 before being run out, Hamish Garner making 20 and Spence Jenks crafting 31 not out. At the end of the innings SPC made 5/142. Ballarat Grammar's batting was strong to begin with but the SPC bowling was tight. With our main bowlers bowling with great line and length and with fielders on their game, SPC won comfortably bowling Grammar out for 80. Of note was Hamish Garner's bowling performance with the figures of 3/3.

Taine clean bowled one of the Grammar batsmen in his third over. Fielding was sharp with SPC collecting three run outs, with one of those a brilliant direct hit from side on by Archie Geyle. Tom Bosworth and Ryan Lister enjoyed very economical spells, both collecting 1/6 and 1/5 respectively. Fletcher Walsh and Harry Broadbent also captured a wicket each. The lush outfield didn't provide much value for shots, forcing the batsmen to really earn their runs. At the end of 25 overs, Grammar had posted 8/87.

Clarke Alaimo and Marty Boyer looked comfortable at the crease until Clarke lost his wicket in the fourth over. A low bouncing delivery caught Marty off guard, causing him to drag the delivery back onto his stumps. Tight bowling and sharp fielding paid dividends for the Grammar boys as they captured the next five wickets for a mere nine runs. Congratulations to Grammar bowler Ronin Wenn who captured a hattrick. Reeling at 7/26 off 11 overs, things were looking pretty grim. Finn Watson, Fletcher Walsh and Cooper McKenzie steadied the ship and showed great concentration to ensure we occupied the crease for all but the last ball of the 25 overs. SPC were finally dismissed for 55, falling 32 runs short of the Grammar total. Thanks to all the lads who volunteered to represent their school and the way in which they conducted themselves was a credit to them. The game was played with great spirit. We extend our thanks to Mr Dean Rossato and his team from Grammar for hosting us and putting on very welcome refreshments at the end of the game.
