EREA Deputy Heads Meeting in Adelaide

I have just returned from three days in Adelaide for the Annual EREA Deputies Conference which was a fantastic opportunity to meet with other Deputy Heads from EREA schools in Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia, Western Australia and Queensland. The conference involved a range of guest speakers with the focus upon leadership in the tradition of Edmund Rice as well as school visits to the three EREA schools in South Australia.

The visits provided an opportunity to look at the facilities in each of the schools as well as looking at future plans and directions for each school. Whilst there are distinct differences between each of the three schools, I was struck by some of the similarities particularly the boys at each of the schools. The boys exhibited the same traits that I witness amongst our boys on a regular basis at St Patrick's College, namely:

- · School pride;
- Connectedness between the boys and between the boys and staff;
- A sense of purpose; and
- A love of the co-curricular activities on offer such as sport, music, public speaking and drama.

There was a familiar feel in this regard in each of the schools and provided me with a sense of belonging to something bigger than simply our magnificent school here in Ballarat! I feel blessed to be part of such a community and look forward to my continued involvement within the St Patrick's community. At times, it is difficult to leave your own family and school environment for these activities, but the benefits are enormous and I thank the Headmaster, Board, staff and students at St Patrick's for supporting my involvement in these activities. Despite returning to what seemed to be hundreds of emails and tasks to do, it was a very engaging and meaningful experience in both a personal and professional sense.

Parental Involvement in Boys' Academic Success

The academic staff continue to work hard in examining ways to provide the best possible Teaching and Learning for all boys enrolled at St Patrick's College. I am extremely confident that through the commitment of staff and the desire to provide the best education for boys in Ballarat that the College will continue to refine its Teaching and Learning programmes and practices.

But what about the parents? Is there a role for them in all of this and if so, how can they assist in the academic journey and progress of their boys? The answer is, of course - yes! The role of parents in supporting students achieve academic success is very important. Many of you will have read and heard of our commitment to the partnership between home and the College in this important endeavour.

Below is a summary of some of the evidence supporting the notion that parental involvement is an influential factor in young students achieving academic success:

 Students from families with above-median parental involvement showed success rates 30% higher than those from families with below-median parental involvement.

- Where teachers reported high levels of outreach to parents, reading scores grew at a rate 50% higher and math test scores 40% higher, than in schools where teachers reported low levels of outreach.
- Studies find that students with involved parents are more likely to:
 - earn higher grades and test scores;
 - pass their classes, earn credits and be promoted;
 - attend school regularly;
 - have better social skills, show good behaviour and adapt well to school; and
 - graduate and go on to further education.
- Programmes that engage families in supporting their children's learning at home are linked to higher student achievement.
- All families can have a positive influence on their children's learning.
- The research evidence is now beyond dispute. When schools work together with families to support learning, children tend to succeed not just in school, but throughout life. In fact, the most accurate predictor of a student's achievement in school is not income or social status, but the extent to which that student's family is able to:
 - Create a home environment that encourages learning;
 - Express high, (but not unrealistic) expectations for their children's achievement and future careers; and
 - Become involved in their children's education at school and in the community.
- Research shows that the number one predictor of students' academic achievement is their mother's educational level followed by the educational level of both parents.

This research was compiled by Dr John H. Wherry, an experienced teacher in his own right and President of the Parent Institute in Virginia, USA. Academic Achievement and Effort Awards

The first award presented at this week's assembly was a Headmaster's Excellence Award to Year 11 student, **Joseph Hall**, in recognition of his outstanding results in VCE Units 3&4 Outdoor and Environmental Studies in semester one. Joseph lost just two marks in the four SAC tasks he completed for Unit 3 of Outdoor and Environmental Studies and attributes his success to two key factors – an ability to link the theory of Outdoor and Environmental Studies to his practical outdoor experiences and Joseph's very good literacy skills. Making a conscientious effort to develop your literacy skills is an important element in attaining your personal best. For Joseph this means taking his reading, comprehension and essay writing skills and using them to help him answer Outdoor and Environmental Studies questions thoroughly. Congratulations Joseph on your Unit 3 results.

A second Headmaster's Excellence Award was presented to Year 7 student, **Thomas Keogh**, in recognition of the quality of his folio of activities completed for the English text, *Hatchet*. Thomas' English teacher, Mrs Canavan, noted that his folio of activities were of a very high standard and demonstrated his ability to think critically and independently. Mrs Canavan also wanted to acknowledge the enthusiasm with which Thomas' participates in class activities and discussions and to congratulate him on the consistency and pride he takes in all of the work he completed. Thomas has also learnt much from Mrs Canavan and is now more focussed on using her assistance and feedback to improve his work. Well done, Thomas, on all your efforts in English last semester!

The third Headmaster's Excellence Award was presented to Year 9 student, Riley Fullerton, in recognition of his excellent Global Sustainability task completed in Immersion last semester. In nominating Riley Mr McKee noted that his work demonstrated a thorough understanding of the impact our reliance on nonrenewable energy has on our environment. In meeting with Riley and reviewing his work, I was particularly struck by the quality of his design of an eco-house. This element of the task required Riley to draw on all the knowledge and skills he developed in the earlier sections of the task to produce a thorough, well detailed design. This is a key skill that all students need to work on as most assessment tasks require students to draw on and bring together a range of skills and knowledge. Too often, students see assessment tasks as a series of small unrelated tasks rather than looking at the bigger picture of what they are really being asked to do. Congratulations, Riley!

A Headmaster's Excellence Award was presented to Year 12 student, Oliver Whitely, in recognition of his success in attaining an accounting cadetship at Deloitte for next year. In nominating Oliver for this award Ms Ryan, Oliver's VCE Unit 3&4 Accounting teacher, wanted to acknowledge how Oliver attained the cadetship just as much as him receiving this opportunity. Oliver was proactive in seeking out and attending information sessions, organising resumes and practice interviews and networking with people in the accounting industry to increase his chances of success. Meeting with Oliver and discussing the process he went through highlighted to me what a significant achievement receiving the cadetship is. Oliver is one of just six young people from over 400 applicants to receive a cadetship. Oliver was also very keen to acknowledge the support he received from Ms Ryan, Mr Brodie and Mrs Taylor. What can other students learn from Oliver? Be prepared to follow something you are interested in all the way to its conclusion, even if you know it will be difficult or challenging. Secondly, use the teachers you have access to. They have much to offer you and can support you in so many ways. Congratulations, Oliver and all the best for your cadetship in 2010.

The last award presented at the assembly was also a Headmaster's Excellence Award and was presented to Year 12 student, Aaron Polson, in recognition of the exceptional quality of his VCE Unit 3 Visual Communication and Design work. Aaron's folio comprehensively outlines his proposal to redevelop the current Ballarat City Hall site into a precinct that the people of Ballarat would use in a way similar to the use of Melbourne's Federation Square. Mr Andrew's, Aaron's teacher, noted that his folio demonstrates the commitment, time and dedication Aaron has to Visual Communication and Design and that this has resulted in a folio worthy of a professional graphic designer. Students were able to judge the quality of Aaron's work by viewing a PowerPoint of selected materials from his design folio. Congratulations Aaron on your outstanding work!

2010 Subject Selection

As Mr Chris Caldow has already noted, subject selection can be an anxious time for parents and students alike. All current Years 9, 10 and 11 students have now received the relevant 2010 Information Booklet and a copy of the 2010 Student Subject Selection Guide. Students have also been emailed an electronic copy of the information booklet and a reminder of the procedures they need to follow over the next fortnight. The 2010 Years 10, 11 and 12 Information booklets can also be accessed via the College's webpage.

One of the key changes for 2010 is the introduction of the Selection Guide. This has been developed at the request of parents and students who were looking for a single subject selection document that led them step-by-step through the various aspects of subject selection for each year level.

Current Year 9 students must see their English, Maths, and Immersion teachers to assist them with their 2010 Year 10 selections before submitting the 2010 Year 10 Subject Selection Guide by **Friday, August 14**. Current Year 9 students proposing to do a VCE 1&2 or a VET certificate in 2010 also need to arrange a meeting with the relevant teacher before submitting their 2010 subject selections.

Current Year 10 students must see their Semester One RE and English teachers to assist them with their 2010 Year 11 selections before submitting the 2010 Year 12 Subject Selection Guide by **Wednesday, August 19**. Current Year 10 students proposing to do a VCE 3&4 or a VET certificate in 2010 also need to arrange a meeting with the relevant teacher before submitting their 2010 subject selections.

Current Year 11 students must see their Semester One RE and English teachers to assist you with your Year 12 selections before submitting the 2010 Year 12 Subject Selection Guide by **Wednesday, August 19**.

Any student interested in one of the external VET certificates offered by the Ballarat Cluster or a School Based Apprenticeship must see the College's Transition Co-ordinator, Mr Anthony Meehan, as a matter of urgency.

Parents and students with questions or concerns about the 2010 subject selection process should contact their son's Pastoral Care Group tutor, the relevant subject teacher or Faculty Head, or Mr Hill.

Saturday is the feast of the first Australian to be beatified, Blessed Mary MacKillop. She has always been a figure to whom both religious and non-religious Australians have been able to relate. Her parents were separated, her health was often poor, she made friends regardless of their personal beliefs and she was misunderstood by those higher than her in the Church even to the point, at one stage, of being wrongfully excommunicated.

Above all else, she was a realist. She was impatient with members of the order she founded who claimed to move on a higher spiritual plain because they had 'visions'. For her, the Kingdom of God was something you worked for and the work was often tough.

By the same token, the real world in which she lived was a place in which she experienced hope. It was this hope that enabled her, in 1865, on the urging of her spiritual director, to move to a small town and start a school for those whose educational opportunities were limited. Such schools, scattered far and wide, became a familiar part of the work of her Sisters of St Joseph and an icon of the Church in Australia.

Secular Australia has ample cause to be grateful to her. For the Christian community, the debt is even greater. Her life and work helped to transplant the message of Jesus to a new country and make it feel at home here. She trusted God even when there was plenty to worry about. She never gave up.
